Eric B. Kaszynski, Jr., director of the Family History Center in Denton, presented (1) an overview of the vast resources available to anyone interested in genealogy at the Center, and (2) an explanation of the importance of family and genealogy to the The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Knowledgeable volunteers staff the Center, and they are eager to help with research. He provided a multi-page handout with more details.

Laura Douglas, librarian in charge of Special Collections, explained the myriad resources available in the Emily Fowler library, either in person and online (via a library card).
