#### SPEAKER: Dr. Ana Krahmer

This month's program will feature Dr. Ana Krahmer speaking about the resources that can be found at The Portal to Texas History. The Portal is a digital repository for historical and cultural heritage materials. The materials hosted on the Portal are the product of collaboration between the University of North Texas Libraries and Portal Partners, which include genealogical societies, museums, libraries, government agencies, and

private collectors. The presentation will provide users with an overview of the Portal to Texas History, how one could use it for their own research interests, and highlights some of the various collections on the Portal.

Dr. Ana Krahmer oversees the Texas Digital Newspaper Program out of The Portal to Texas History, hosted by University of North Texas Libraries. She works with partners across Texas to digitally preserve and build access to their newspaper runs. The Texas Digital Newspaper Program is the largest, single-state, open-access repository of newspapers in the U.S., and she loves teaching people how to use it for their research.

#### OCTOBER IS FAMILY HISTORY MONTH

This month is the perfect opportunity to review your ancestry and honor their memory, and to involve your family in understanding their heritage.

Write down what you already know about your parents and ancestors. Share this information with your children, making sure they understand how important it is to keep this information alive.



#### **SEPT 2019 MINUTES**

President Joe Spears called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance. He introduced himself and welcomed everyone. President Spears thanked the Board members for supplying refreshments for the meeting.

Membership Chairman Deb Reed introduced four visitors: Lamont Brown, Emily Richardson, Cecile Sutter, and Monica Werthold. There were 23 members in attendance.

#### **BUSINESS**

The Minutes of the May meeting were approved as published in the newsletter. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Eileen O'Neill Windsor, seconded by Bob Lane. President Spears reported the Society's bank balance was \$2,972.55.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

President Spears reported Walta Evans, long-time Hospitality Chairman, is ill. He asked for volunteers to take her place. Bob and Linda Lane agreed to serve.

#### ANNOUNCEMENTS

The annual Library Lock-In is scheduled for October 18. Attendance is free, but registration is required. This year's sponsor is the McLennan County Genealogy Society.

The GenPen Writers Group's next meeting is scheduled for Sunday, September 22.

The next Genealogy Meetup is scheduled for Friday, September 27, at 9:30 a.m.

The Society's next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, October 10.

Librarian Laura Douglas reported Matt Davis is working on the Library's collection of Denton papers. Anyone having documents to donate are encouraged to submit them.

#### **PROGRAM**

The evening's program, "Local Resources for Long Distance Research," was presented by Eric Kaszynski, director of Denton's Family History Center, and Laura Douglas, Librarian in Charge of Special Collections, Denton Public Library.

Director Kaszynski presented a refresher on the newest resources and techniques for genealogical research available through the Family History Center and its web site www.familysearch.org.

Personal research assistance is available through the Center's volunteers, as well as access to records not available online and free how-to classes—all at no charge.

The Denton Library is an official Family Search Affiliate, which provides free access to limited-access FamilySearch databases.

The Family Search website offers free, noobligation access to all its online records, and maintains a research Wiki, a huge encyclopedia of information about records availability. "The Family History Guide" on the site offers how-to articles on all kinds of subjects. He stressed that he and the Center's volunteers are waiting and eager to help anyone further their family research.

Librarian Laura Douglas offered a refresher on resources available in the Library's Genealogy Collection.

"Don't Forget the Books." The Library has many reference books, such as *The Source* and *The Vital Records Handbook*, as well as indexes not available elsewhere. Books can be located through the Library's online catalog using "Search"—some books are scanned. Also, the "Search" tab leads to WorldCat and Interlibrary loan.

Under "Research Tools," there is a tab for "Genealogy" (set up by former librarian Kathy Strauss), and many related subjects. Douglas stressed that many online databases (such as Fold3 and Heritage Quest) are available from home with a library card (free to Denton residents, \$50.00/yr for non-residents).

In-Library resources include "American Ancestors (NEHGS)", Ancestry Library Edition, Newspaper Archives, and History Geo.com. Patrons can bring laptops and access them using their personal computers, but only inside the library.

In addition, the Library offers Adult Discovery Kits for checkout, the Legacy Lab, and numerous classes and events. A staff of four is eager to help with anyone's genealogy research. They can be contacted by calling emailing, or asking in person for help.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
